There are many fantastic areas of Stratford-upon-Avon to explore, which is why visitors flock back year after year to discover more. From quaint side streets with unique and individual shops to open parklands along the river, there's something for everyone.

> Following the suppression of the Guild of the Holy Cross, King Edward VI granted a charter of incorporation to Stratford-upon-Avon on 28 June 1553. The charter conferred on the inhabitants a borough constitution comprising the right to hold, and collect tolls from, a weekly Thursday market and two annual fairs. In 1819 under the authorisation of George III the Charter Market was changed to a Friday. Markets continue in the town as an important part of the local retail offer.

Our Conference Hotel

Crowne Plaza Stratford upon Avon is set amid landscaped gardens beside the River Avon, just 10 minutes off the M40 motorway. There is plentiful on-site parking and the town centre is a two-minute walk away. Stratfordupon-Avon railway station is a mile away, with frequent trains to London and Birmingham.
